TOPIC: Using Facilitated Methods to Perform a Rigorous Business Impact Analysis

The presentation given by Brian Zawada of Protiviti is summarized in the following abstract – as provided by Protiviti:

Abstract: "Using Facilitated Methods to Perform a Rigorous Business Impact Analysis"

The attacks on New York and Washington in September, and the bio-terrorism events of October, led most organizations to revisit their business continuity management processes. Despite this renewed interest to include customer mandates for continuity of operations processes, funding for business continuity wasn't budgeted, and budget variances were minimal. Certainly the economy has been a factor, but internal business continuity professionals have also indicated they are having a hard time making the business case for increased BCP investment. Taken one step further, our clients have pointed to the Business Impact Analysis as the key issue. Executives are finding that the BIA results are too high-level, incomplete or are not rooted in business reality.

Our presentation will focus on ways to bridge the gap between the business continuity professional and the executive-level decision-maker using a rigorous, business-oriented BIA methodology. We will highlight strategies and tools that can assist the planner, as well as an outline of the information that should be compiled and presented to the C-level executive.
